




Our Growing Numbers

AfriPass is an AfriLabs product that seeks to connect Africa's innovation ecosystem through a digital community platform. AfriPass enables entrepreneurs to access hub services and co-working space across the continent with their unique masterpass subscription, and also connects hub staff to access discounted shared working and living spaces in any part of the continent.

Through the AfriPass platform, entrepreneurs can look up different hub services, located in any country and seamlessly get directions to any hub of their choice, where they wish to use the hub's services. The Location map and hub services booking feature will be integrated into the platform to allow entrepreneurs directly book for services and get direction to the hub through the platform.

Building Capacity in Tech Hubs

Over the years, AfriLabs has carried out research on African hub needs, capacity gaps and best practices. Based on this research, AfriLabs designs and runs a series of initiatives targeting hubs. These initiatives have now been updated and expanded into the AfriLabs Capacity Building Programme (ACBP), A 2m euro capacity building project, being implemented thanks to Agence Française de Développement (AFD)'s support through the Digital Africa seed fund.

We are confident that strengthening hubs will have a multiplier effect and contribute to growing the African innovation ecosystem while increasing the percentage of successful and investment-ready startups on the continent.

Key activities include:

- 30 Physical workshops in 15 convening African cities.
- 12 Quarterly Hubs Learning Weeks a series of peer to peer virtual capacity building webinars.
- Full Hub Management Certification Course in partnership with a major African University.
- Hubs-in-Residence at AfriLabs Annual Gathering 2020 and 2021.
- Toolkits on business development and investment management.
- Virtual meetup grants (2,000 euros per selected hub)
- Capacity building awards (15,000 euros per selected hub)
- Travel sponsorship for hubs in residence program, physical workshops, etc.

Hubs Learning Week

The AfriLabs Hubs Learning Week is a series of peer to peer capacity building virtual workshops that empower innovation hub managers and staff with requisite and formal incubation management training and skills needed to start, operate and expand hubs/innovation centres in Africa. This activity is carried out under the AfriLabs Capacity Building Programme (ACBP) supported by the Agence Française de Développement (AFD) through the Digital Africa seed fund.



As at March 2021, five (5) series of the Hubs Learning Week have taken place with over 2000 participants including Hub managers and Hub staff in 54 countries in Africa and 2 countries in the diaspora have been attended the Learning Week.

Virtual Meetup Grants

Each of the 12 Hubs Learning Weeks under the AfriLabs Capacity Building Programme (ACBP) will feature webinars focused on stakeholder management and ecosystem community engagement.

After these specific webinars, applications for submission of meetup ideas tailored to implementing the lessons learned from the webinars will be accepted and successful hubs will be awarded 2,000 euros each to execute the Virtual Meetups in their respective cities.



During the course of the ACBP, the top 36 submissions (one per city) across the 12 Learning Weeks will be granted 2,000 euros each to execute the Virtual Meetups. As at March 2021, 12 Hubs have been awarded with grants worth 24,000 euros.

Capacity Building Awards

The Capacity Building Awards is an activity within the Capacity Building Program that provides a grant of 15,000 euros to winning hubs within the AfriLabs network to implement projects for the hubs and startups within their network which showcases the application of capacity building models..

As part of the award, winning hubs also access free mentoring during the grant implementation period to enhance their chances of succeeding as Hubs.



The first edition of the Capacity Building Awards held in October 2020 and awarded 17 hubs the grants worth 255,000 euros, 8 of which are carrying out cross regional collaborative projects. The second edition held in October 2021 during the AfriLabs 10th anniversary gala, hosted by the Nigerian Vice-President. 12 hubs received a total of 180,000 euros in grants.

Through this activity, over 200 startups have been trained and supported with 78% being female led startups.

AfriLabs Academy

The AfriLabs Academy is an initiative of AfriLabs and implemented under the AfriLabs Capacity Building Programme that is designed to equip African Hub managers and staff with the training and management skills needed to improve their ability and capacity to support the growing number of startups and MSMEs in their communities.



Funding for a more sustainable African Startup Ecosystem

The Catalyst Programme is a cross-stakeholder initiative of AfriLabs in conjunction with (African Business Angels Network) ABAN that aims to strengthen entrepreneurs, startups, hubs and angel investors, while delivering impact results to institutional funders.

The Catalyst Programme raises funds (debt or grant) from various institutional partners to add to a pool. This pool serves as a matching or co-investment fund to encourage investment in viable AfriLabs-affiliated startups by verified angel investors. The criteria for accessing fund from this pool are as follows.

- Affiliation with hubs that are members of the AfriLabs Network. These hubs will help to administer and track use/impact of the investments.
- Offer of investment from investors affiliated to angel networks that are members of ABAN.

These investors are encouraged to invest because their investment is doubled/matched and hubs help to track/monitor their investment.

The success of this initiative will lead to:

- More African startups that are better funded and are better monitored
- · Hubs that are able to attract and retain quality startups and a viable hub sustainability model
- Angel investors who are able to invest in a larger portfolio, de-risked significantly by the monitoring and reporting from the hubs
- · Better visibility, transparency and objective impact reporting for the funders.
- · Overall stronger, more sustainable African startup ecosystem.

3. The Global EdTech Hub



Meet the EDTech Hub

The EdTech Hub is a collaboration between the Overseas Development Institute, Faculty of Education at the University of Cambridge, Results for Development, Open Development and Education, Brink, Jigsaw Consult, BRAC, AfriLabs, and eLearning Africa.

Funded by the Foreign, Commonwealth, and Development Office (FCDO) - formerly DFID, the World Bank and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the EdTech Hub seeks to help improve education technology in developing countries.

AfriLabs is a regional partner of The EdTech Hub.

The EdTech Hub aims to accelerate progress toward ending the global learning crisis by increasing the

use of evidence to inform decision-making about education technology.

The EdTech Hub will synthesize existing evidence, conduct new research, support innovations to scale, and provide advisory support to governments and other country partners.

Understanding the impact of COVID-19

Early in March 2020, Africa's Covid-19 cases by country were in the single digits, but by mid-month those numbers had spiked, leading the World Health Organisation to sound an alarm. This has led many within the African innovation ecosystems to look for ways to address the impacts of the pandemic.

In order to track the impact of the pandemic on the innovation ecosystem in Africa, AfriLabs and KTN Global Alliance worked together to deliver a rapid analysis of innovation response to the Covid-19 pandemic, with focuses on Kenya, Nigeria and South Africa. Our research looked into the impact of the pandemic on the innovation ecosystem, the response to it, the success and failures, and the opportunities to strengthen the African innovation ecosystem.



Supporting Innovative Responses to the impact of COVID-19

COVIDaction, a partnership between Foreign, Commonwealth, and Development Office (FCDO) - formerly DFID Frontier Technology Hub, Global Disability Innovation Hub (GDI Hub), UCL Institute of Healthcare Engineering worked to build a technology and innovation pipeline to support action related to the COVID-19 pandemic, with a focus on Africa.



6. Project Rollo



A case for new support models

African Entrepreneurship Ecosystem have grown fast in the last decade in many industries. However, the support system models for small businesses have always been inspired and developed from outside the continent. Support systems like coworking spaces, incubators, hackathons, and accelerators normally address and fit only formal businesses that have a different level of maturity, different macro and micro-economics and different market outlooks and different investments needs. For the last few years, we noticed that African businesses need a new model that respects the local context, level of maturity, background and local education, growth of business, and response to local risk and crises. This was clear when the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic affected Small African Businesses and the ecosystem shutdown. Project Rollo is a capacity building program dedicated to supporting Medium and Small African Enterprises facing challenges to survive after the COVID-19 outbreak and to provide evidence-based policy guidance on the most impactful stimulus packages and the creation of new support models using evidence-based data gathered through the innovative Rollo21 simulation model on MSMEs. The pilot stage of the project took place in Senegal, Cameroon, Zimbabwe, Sudan and Egypt.

7. AGA Innovation Challenge - Accelerator Training: Democracy And Governance In Africa



The Virtual Acceleration Program

The African Union - African Governance Architecture (AGA) organized a Youth Innovation Challenge which called for African innovators, incubation centers as well as innovation hubs with initiatives that contribute to democracy and good governance. Applications were sent in from across Africa and the diaspora, a total of 20 innovators were shortlisted to receive support beginning from a one-week intensive virtual accelerator program. The virtual accelerator program was implemented under the AGA -COMESA (Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa) joint project on youth engagement in democratic governance and sociology economic development processes in Africa in support of the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC). The virtual accelerator was developed and executed by AfriLabs from the 23rd to 30th November 2020.

The one-week virtual accelerator program aims to grow the participating innovators and their innovations. This will entail bringing onboard experts as facilitators and coaches and making available crucial industry, technical and business knowledge to the innovators. The program consists of:

- A joint goal setting session with innovators and their coaches
- One-week intensive virtual training sessions
- Daily coach check-ins with innovators
- An inspirational talk session by top industry professionals
- A Pitch Day
- Follow-on coaching, the intensity of which will be decided based on each innovator's performance and needs.

7. The AU Digital and Innovation Fellowship















The AU Digital and Innovation Fellowship

The African Union launched the AU Digital and Innovation Fellowship program on September 20, 2021, together with its partners, GIZ and AfriLabs. The launch included the participation of key representatives from the AU Commission and focus departments, BMZ, GIZ, AfriLabs, AfriLabs member hubs and other key players from the African innovation ecosystem.

The AU Digital and Innovation Fellowship program will identify and deploy highly competent tech innovators within the African continent to departments within the African Union Headquarters and organs as 'resident fellows' to understand the system and processes within those departments and organs; identify challenges within the system and propose solutions to these challenges.

The Fellows will be expected to co-create and build innovative tailor-made products and processes that improve the delivery of the African Union's mandate especially in the context of good governance and citizens engagement. Additionally, the program will seek to facilitate conditions for building the internal capacity of the host African Union organs in the long term.

The program will last for a period of 12 months and is fully implemented by AfriLabs.








AfriLabs and Djembe Consultants Insights Report on Building a Resilient Innovative Africa in a COVID-19 World



1. AfriLabs Annual Gathering In Africa

The AfriLabs Annual Gathering provides a unique opportunity for hubs in the AfriLabs network and other stakeholders in the African tech ecosystem to convene, network, share knowledge around a common theme and build partnerships.

The Annual Gathering was held in Ghana in 2016, in Egypt in 2017, in Tanzania in 2018 and in Ethiopia in 2019 which brought together over 500 key stakeholders of the African technology, innovation and entrepreneurial ecosystem from the public and private sectors, to network and share knowledge.

The 5th Afrilabs Annual Gathering held on 12th to 14th October 2020, which was the first virtual edition of the Afrilabs Annual Gathering. Our decision is informed by advice from the World Health Organisation (WHO) and Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (Africa CDC), as well as leading global and local health authorities.



2019 AfriLabs Annual Gathering

The 4th Edition of the AfriLabs Annual Gathering held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia from 26-28 October 2019. In partnership with the Africa Union, the Gathering focused on connecting players of the African innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem, which includes hubs, innovators, entrepreneurs, researchers, academia, venture capitalists, development agencies, investors, governments as well as business development organisations, creatives amongst others. Over 350 leaders and decision makers of these stakeholder groups were present and new initiatives for the African Tech Ecosystem were launched. They include the Catalyst, AfriLabs Capacity Building Programme and EdTech Hub.



2020 AfriLabs Annual Gathering




2021 AfriLabs Annual Gathering





Over 2000 innovation enablers trained across Africa in 2020

- Over 2,000 members of the innovation enablers community in 56 countries and the 5 regions of Africa have been trained on how they can better support startups.
- 12 attendees from the workshops were given the total of 24,000 euros to host virtual meetup grants focused on different areas of stakeholder engagement.
- Over 1200 stakeholders have been engaged through the Virtual Meetup Grants and 58% of these stakeholders are females.

This was carried out under the AfriLabs Capacity Building Programme by the AFD under the Digital Africa Seed Fund.

- 17 hubs in 12 countries in the different regions of Africa were selected to execute 13 projects under the AfriLabs Capacity Building Programme.

- So far 1268 individuals have been supported via trainings and mentoring activities through the Capacity Building Awards of which 89% are women.




